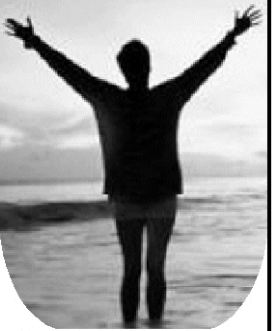
Doubts and fears arise early in the morning, and late at night.
