"YOU CAN'T TAKE IT BACK"

Do you watch your words? Do you often consider what you say to others? There are some things you've said that you wish you could take back. What if you said them and they were recorded in the Bible? For thousands of years, you would be remembered as the person who said that. Let's look at some things that shouldn't have been said and the implications. Adam was the first man. Like all other men, he was the first to say something he shouldn't. Adam and Eve had a great gig. The only "Thou shalt not" was to not eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. So, they did just that. When God began to question them, Adam said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate" (Gen. 3:12). The first person ever thrown under the bus was Eve. They both were given punishment for the transgression (Gen. 3:16-19). However, it was Adam that was called out as the transgressor (Rom. 5:12-15). He could have made a difference, but he blamed others. A few years later, Aaron was at the base of Mt. Sinai. It had been a while, and Moses had not come back down. So, the people came to Aaron and asked him to make them a god (Ex. 32:1). Aaron asked for their golden ear ring and fashioned a golden calf for them. Moses came down the mountain and asked what was happening, and Aaron said, "I said to them, 'Whosoever has any gold, let them tear it off.' So they gave it to me, and I threw it into the fire, and out came this calf" (Ex. 32:24). "It was an accident" or "It just happened" are not good choices. "Forgive me for I have sinned," would be a better approach. We must watch our words. Jesus said we will give account for them in judgment. John 12:48. This is a passage that often goes overlooked.

ONE WORD WORTH A \$100

Rudyard Kipling the poet unlike so many other writers of his time, was fortunate enough to enjoy success while he lived. He made a great deal of money at his trade. On one occasion a reporter approached him and said, "Mr. Kipling, I just read that somebody calculated that the money you make from your writings amounts to over a hundred dollars a word." Mr. Kipling raised his eyebrows and said, "Really? I certainly wasn't aware of that." The reporter cynically reached into his pocket and pulled out a hundred dollar bill, held it out to Kipling, and said, "Here's a hundred dollars, Mr. Kipling. Now, give me one of your hundred dollar words." Kipling looked at the hundred dollar bill for a moment, took it and folded it up, put it in his pocket and said, "Thanks." Kipling is right! Come to think of it, "thanks" is more than just a hundred dollar word. It is one of God's holy words. Really, it seems to be one of His favorite holy words! The Scriptures are saturated with teaching about thanksgiving! The words "thank, thanks, thankful, and thanksgiving" are, used at least 134 times in the New King James Version of the Bible! What does it mean when God teaches, comments on, or gives commands concerning a certain subject at least 134 times? At least two things: 1st, He is serious about this! He commands thanksgiving so frequently in the Bible that it is impossible to conclude this is unimportant to Him; 2nd, it must mean He wants it to be important to us! He won't let us forget to be thankful! First Thessalonians 5:18 sums up all God says about giving thanks, "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Why be thankful in every circumstance? Because those who wait for perfect people, places, and circumstances will never be happy or thankful. As Norman Vincent Peale said, "Problems are a part of life. All of us are going to have. problems right up to the moment we die. And some of you are going to have problems after you die." Thanksgiving is more than a hundred dollar word. It is a way of thinking and living that will alter us whether God ever alters our circumstances or not. Gratitude is not a matter of chance but a matter of choice. DAN
