"WONDERFUL GRACE OF JESUS"

Instead of being burdened by the continual reminder of our sins, we are encouraged by grace and forgiveness and spurred on to submit to God's will because we are thankful for what He has done. This is the significance of Titus 2:11-14. The grace of God teaches us to do God's will, not because we think we are flawless, but because we are grateful for God's salvation. This, in turn, makes us zealous for good works (cf. Eph 2:8-10). The fruit is sanctification and life (6:22). Seeing our justification in light of grace is why we can consider ourselves dead to sin and alive to God (v. 11). Instead of continually seeing ourselves as a failures before God, God says we are to think of ourselves as alive to Him. This is not saying we are flawless or never aware of sin. It is saying that we are seeing ourselves more as God sees us. Our minds have been renewed. Our thinking is changing. "For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace." (Rom 8:5-6). We are under God's wonderful grace, but we must live according the God's Word. We can remove ourselves from grace by refusing to do so. Isn't it time to view grace in its proper perspective? DAN
